The story of its growth from a small institution in the pre-independence India to a well-established

## **Pedagogical & Cultural activities**

### • Mentor System and Morning Assembly

With a view to render an affective level to the teacher education programme and to provide better individualized help and guidance, the college follows the mentor group system. All the 209 students of the college have been randomly divided into 14 groups and have been assigned a mentor from the staff. The students meet their mentors periodically once a week, they are also encouraged to consult their mentors in case of any academic or personal problems. The Mentor groups in charge maintain the cumulative record profile of each student of their group and monitor their progress throughout the session. Each group also organizes one morning assembly which is a weekly feature of the college calendar. All the students of a group collectively organize and participate in these assemblies which are a forum to teach public speaking along with inculcating moral and religious values.

## • 75<sup>th</sup> Independence Day celebration

Students and faculty of the college celebrated 75<sup>th</sup> Independence Day with full fervor. A series of activities like Online Quiz, Essay Writing, Slogan Writing, and Poster Making competitions were organized by the Punjabi Sahitya Sabha, Blue Bells English Literary Society, Social Vision Club and Fine Arts Department of the college. In quiz competition a total of 693 students of various

colleges and schools of Punjab took part.

#### • Celebration of Swatchta Pakhwara

N.S.S. wing of the College organized various activities to celebrate Swachhta Pakhwara from August 1- 15, as per directions of NSS Directorate, Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Govt. of India. ## INFRASTRUCTURE & LEARNING RESOURCES

The college has built a modern infrastructure in the form of multi-storey buildings for M.Ed. and B.Ed. courses, with all the requisite facilities for healthy and facilitative academic environment.

## At present the college has:

• A Wi-Fi campus with leased line connection facility. The computer lab provides numerous computing facilities for its students and faculty members. The computer lab has more than 53 computers with latest operating systems and latest software. In addition the college also has Laptops, Smart board, Visualiser etc. The E.T. lab has 9 LCD projectors, 12 overhead projectors, 6 LCD televisions in addition to other equipment. ERP software developed by the college has been initiated for college automation.

- Multi-purpose hall has Permanent stage fitted with sound system, a projector with motorized screen, LED. Seating capacity for more than 300 persons.
- A prominent feature of the college is language lab having a facility of 20 users. It
  focuses on training pupils in Pronunciation, Group discussions, Extempore, Drill
  activities etc.
- Psychology and Guidance Laboratory has nearly 100 Psychological tests.
- The college has a fully functional Internal Quality Assurance Cell which was established in 2009. The main aim of IQAC is planning, implementing and measuring the outcomes of academic and administrative performance of the college.
- Smart Classroom with Learning Gallery is used to teach faculty and students to integrate technology in their lives.
- The Science & Mathematics lab is well equipped with scientific devices to enhance teaching-learning process.
- Art and Craft Resource room is used to develop and nurture creative talent among the students. It is fully equipped with materials which help the students to prepare charts, models and other teaching aids.
- Sports room with Gymnasium is available within campus for the students as well as the faculty.
- College has a fully functional Research Cell in order to promote research activities among the students and the staff.
- Method Laboratory is well equipped to sharpen the teaching skills of the student teachers. It is used to record the lessons delivered by them.
- The college has installed digital security monitoring cameras spread over the college campus for administrative supervision
- Separate hostel facilities have been provided for boys and girls with all amenities like coolers, geysers, LCD TV and computer with Internet facility with "Radio Link Dedicated Lease Line."

#### **LIBRARY**

The institution has a very rich and resourceful library with a rare collection of books, journals and magazines. The college library is automated and all the books are barcoded thus enabling easy functioning of library, acquiring and organizing, preserving, retrieving and disseminating information to the users, especially the circulation system. Numerous books are added to the college library stock every year, this year too the college Library Committee purchased books and journals worthRs. 27,407. At present the college library has

- Library data is automated using ILMS as well as maintained manually. This software has been developed by In-house ERP team of the college. It is fully automated. This software keeps record of all the books available in the library and an account of issue as well as return of books.
- The library provides OPAC facility and it is available through ERP.. It provides access to WEB
  OPAC for its readers who can access these facilities on their personal computers/mobile with
  user ID s and Passwords given to them from anywhere.
- Membership of INFLIBNET helps teachers to access e-journals and e-books on N-LIST by INFLIBNET. The username and password is issued to every teacher. They can access this facility from anywhere by using the internet.
- Seven P.Cs. with internet in the cyber Library.

- Photostat machine for students' use.
- The library has two reading rooms, one Research section, one Reference section, Administrative and Technical section, etc.
- The institute has a special Research section in the library to carry out the task of research in the field of education at the post-graduation level. It consists of number of National and International journals, educational surveys, research books, dissertations, Ph.D. theses, research oriented magazines etc. This cell provides the best resources to pursue the research work under one roof.
- In the library a Rare Section is maintained which has very old books.

#### Research Journal

The College research journal 'GHG Journal of Sixth Thought' is published biannually. It is an Indexed and Peer Reviewed Journal.

#### **Central Students' Council**

The college has an active student council which is democratically elected. The members of this Council are chosen from the five houses viz. Joy, Peace, Hope, Glory and Harmony and they participate in all the meetings of Central Students" Council which are periodically organized in the Principal's office.
