Institutional Legacy and Identity

Established in the sacred memory of Guru Hargobind Sahib Ji, the sixth Guru of the Sikhs and embodiment of spiritual and temporal sovereignty, G.H.G. Khalsa College of Education is not merely an academic institution but a movement that embodies legacy, learning, and leadership. Its inception can be traced to 1921, when Nihang Shamsheer Singh Ji, a seer far ahead of his time, envisioned an educational sanctuary at Gurusar Sadhar — a vision that began with a modest Gurmukhi Pathshala and, through steadfast perseverance, blossomed into a high school by 1928, an intermediate college in 1948, and later a fully-fledged degree college.

The College of Education was formally instituted in 1955, initiating a new era of professional teacher training with a B.T. (now B.Ed.) program, eventually expanding into postgraduate teacher education with the commencement of the M.Ed. program in 1982. Today, the college holds sanctioned strength of 100 B.Ed. and 50 M.Ed. seats and operates under the permanent affiliation of Panjab University, Chandigarh, with full recognition from the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE).

It is a matter of great institutional prestige that the college has been conferred Grade ‘A’ accreditation by NAAC across two successive cycles, with CGPA scores of 3.04 and 3.30, respectively and A+ grade in the third cycle with CGPA of 3.31. Furthermore, our designation as a Mentor Institution under the UGC’s PARAMARSH Scheme positions us as a lighthouse for academic quality enhancement across peer institutions.

Visionary Impact and Academic Culture

Our college has carved a distinctive identity as a crucible of leadership in teacher education. With pride, we acknowledge our reputation as the “Nursery of Principals,” having contributed more than 15 Principals to Colleges of Education across Punjab. Our graduates are not only school educators and teacher trainers — they are thought leaders, institution builders, and policy influencers in the domain of education.

The academic culture of G.H.G. Khalsa College of Education is defined by excellence without compromise. Our student outcomes in Panjab University examinations continue to reflect exceptional consistency, with results nearly touching 100% each year for both B.Ed. and M.Ed. programs. Yet, our vision extends beyond grades — we strive to nurture critical thinkers, reflective practitioners, and socially responsible educators.

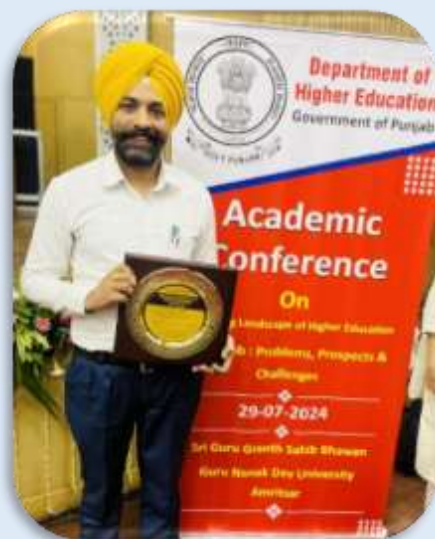
MISSION

Session Highlights

- **Blended Instructional Management** (Dr. Deepika Kohli – April 7)
Explored blended learning models (e.g., flipped classroom, station rotation), digital tools (Zoom, Padlet, Speechify), and instructional strategies customized to learner diversity. Emphasis was placed on digital literacy and professional development tools.

- **Equity and Inclusion** (*Dr. Monica Mahajan – April 8*)
Focused on diversity intelligence (DQ), inclusive education policies, differentiated instruction, and equity over equality. Addressed teacher roles in fostering empathy, accessibility, and dismantling attitudinal barriers.
- **Life Skills** (*Bhavdeep Kohli – April 9, Morning*)

Provided hands-on guidance on resume design, interview strategies (mnemonics like IMPACT, IN-FORM), and mock interviews. Dr. Rana also demonstrated techniques for handling demo lessons effectively.

Clarified concepts and differences between measurement, assessment, and evaluation using engaging role-play. Covered domains of learning (cognitive, affective, psychomotor), formative/summative assessments, and evaluation rubrics.

Introduced essential Punjab Government education portals like ePunjab, HRMS, and apps like Diksha, Read-to-Me, and Punjab Educare. Emphasized the digital readiness of teachers and institutional tools for content delivery and management.
- **Communication Skills & Public Speaking** (*Dr. Munish Jindal – April 13*)
Shared strategies for impactful presentations, power communication, body language, and the 5 P’s: Positive, Prepared, Productive, Polite, and Respectful. Encouraged self-affirmation and goal setting through an action plan.

TEACHING INTERNSHIP: BRIDGING THEORY AND PRACTICE

► Skill Enhancement and Pre-Practice Programme

The Skill Enhancement and Pre-Practice Programme at GHG Khalsa College of Education, Gurusar Sadhar, aimed to provide B.Ed Semester-3 students with essential skills and practical experience before their internship in August. This meticulously planned programme, held from July 18 to July 31, 2024, included various workshops, simulated teaching sessions, and innovative activities designed to enhance pedagogical skills. Under the dynamic leadership of Principal Dr. Pargat Singh Garcha and the dedicated efforts of internship in-charges Dr. Rachhpal Singh and Dr. Manpreet Kaur, the programme ensured a comprehensive learning experience for future educators.



►Commencement of Internship for B.Ed Semester 3 Pupil Teachers

The internship program for B.Ed Semester 3 pupil teachers of GHG Khalsa College of Education, Sadhar, began on **August 1, 2024, and continued until November 30, 2024**. 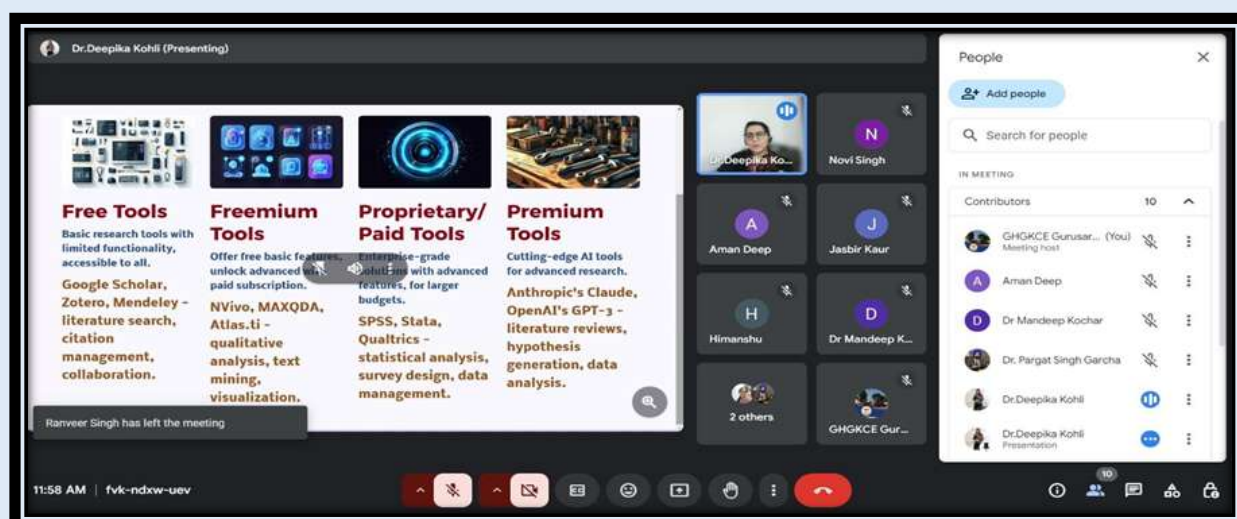

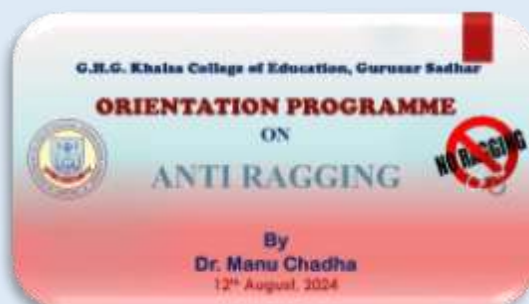
