Report of the Electoral Literacy Club (2020 to 2022)

Establishment of Electoral Literacy Club in the College

The college had received a letter from the office of Chief Electoral Officer Punjab regarding the establishment of electoral literacy clubs in educational institutions on March 12, 2020.

The election commission of India had initiated a National program in 2010 titled systematic voters education and electoral participation (SVEEP) with an aim to focus on voter awareness and information and motivation of voters for enhancing electoral participation. Carrying forward (SVEEP) the initiative in the year 2018, the ECI started the "Continuous electoral literacy and democracy education program" with the aim of main streaming of electoral literacy among the young and future voters through and extra- curricular interventions at the school college and university level. ECI has decided to establish electoral literacy clubs in educational institutions for strengthening the culture of electoral participation among young and future voters. The idea behind establishing such clubs is that they shall be the seat of learning through hands-on experience and envisaged to serve as a vibrant hub of electoral literacy in educational institutions in the country. Electoral Literacy Clubs are being set up in the country to promote electoral literacy in all age groups of the Indian citizens through engaging and interesting activities and hands-on experience but in an apolitical, neutral and non-partisan manner. Electoral Literacy Clubs are especially being set up in colleges all across India targeting the new voters. The club will have all the students from all semesters as its members.

- To facilitate EVM and VVPAT familiarization and education about the robustness of EVM as well as the integrity of the electoral process using EVMs;
- To help the target audience understand the value of their vote and exercise their right to franchise in a confident, comfortable and ethical manner;
- To harness the potential of ELC members for carrying the electoral literacy in communities:
- To facilitate voter registration for its eligible members who are not yet registered;
- To develop a culture of electoral participation and maximize the informed and ethical voting and follow the principle 'Every vote counts' and 'No Voter to be Left Behind'.

Electoral Literacy Club, also promotes democratic values and vigilance among students through various engaging activities, programs and hand-on experiences. It helps students by providing an environment where they can learn, grow, and develop altogether through the umbrella of activities like interactive sessions, seminars, and panel discussions by inviting distinguished dignitaries, motivators, mentors, scholars, bureaucrats, etc. It makes the youth democratically attentive and prepares them for their future by conducting various open and inhouse activities and events that benefit the students as well as the country at the large.

Composition: The Electoral Literacy Club of the college is a representative body of the college, its members include faculty, students, non-teaching staff, and is consciously diverse and inclusive.Dr. Pargat Singh Garcha is the Patron of the club, Dr. Jasleen Kaur, Dr. Jasvir Kaur, Dr. Jasbir Kaur and Dr. Manpreet Kaur are faculty coordinators. The class representatives of B.Ed and M.Ed are the student coordinators and the membership is open to all.


National Voters' Day and Republic Day (25th January, 2022)
