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Session 2019-20

For the session 2019-20 curriculum feedback from 88 students were collected comprising statements related to different aspects of curriculum: Both quantitative and qualitative analysis were conducted. Description is as under:


Qualitative Analysis:


- As the year 2019-20 was under the influence of Covid pandemic the students felt difficulty having access to e-education due to non-exposure. Thus students demanded that E- education should be made compulsory.
- Students suggested that more E- resources should be made available to the them
- There must be some Seminars for boosting the self -confidence of the students.
- Students demanded more exposure to communication skills especially for English language.
- Students were of the view that more Exposure to ICT and new technologies will be given by the institution to cope with the demands of the global world.
- Workshops related to skill development should be conducted (soft skills, teaching skills, personality enhancement) etc.
- Extension lectures and seminars on issues and challenges in educational field must be there.


Quantitative Analysis


- 1. Induction/orientation programme conducted in the beginning of each semester got a rating of 68% in the category of excellent followed by 29% as V. Good and 30% reported good for this feature of the curriculum. On the suggestions of the students, the institution introduced new elective/ optional subjects and it is clear from the feedback that more than 65% of students rated excellent for flexibility dimension and remaining 35 % were also more than satisfied (Very good and good).
- 2. Curriculum objectives were as per the need of the hour as reported by 54% of the student population through excellent grading. The practices used by the institution for curriculum delivery got an excellent rating of 80% which speaks about the efforts made by the institution to introduce varietyin curriculum transaction and satisfaction on the part of students. An educational activity is unfruitful, if it remains unsuccessful in broadening the vision of the students and helping them to develop an insight about the system of which they are an integral part. This vision could be developed only through the linkages between the institution and thesociety at large. As clear from the feedback 56% students were in favor of excellent efforts made by the institution in this direction and 31% and 16 reported very good and goodattempts.


- 3. It's the duty of the institution to facilitate students for better results and the feedback received clearly showed that out of 85% of students reported that they had an access to excellent resources and remaining reported very good and good respectively. Teaching learning is a two way process and effective communication is must to carry this process smoothly. As clear from the feedback 65% students reported that they got an excellent exposure in communication and other reported very good and good level of communication on the part of teachers.
- 4. Catering to the diverse student population is both a challenge and mission of this institution. Every effort has been made by the institution to deal with diversity by giving all types of exposures and need fulfillment as reported through excellent grading by 65% of the student population. To deal with the individual issues and problems the institution works on the mentor-mentee relationship and feedback received is a record of how well the institution is handling and providing mentor- mentee services as reported by 83% students as excellent and remaining as very good and good.
- 5. Evaluative practices used by the institution are fair enough as reported by majority of students (80%) similarly a very high rating is received for methods of teaching as the most interactive one as reported by 91% of students. Teachers also prepare well for their classroom interactions and they use multiple modes of teaching and learning as clear from the feedback.
- 6. Pre-Internship and Internship is the foundation of the teacher education programme and this institution focuses very well on the both as clear from the feedback (Excellent 64% followed by 28% as very good and 8% as good).
- 7. Institution has enriched resources and every effort is done for its optimum utilization and maintenance. Moreover, different support services are also run by the institution smoothly as reported by students through excellent grading.
- 8. Co-curricular activities should be an integral part of the overall curriculum framework of any educational institution and rich exposure is given to the students on this front. Feedback is clearly indicating that 79% students reported excellent for the opportunities provided to them for their wholesome personality development.
- 9. For maintaining a healthy environment, it is essential that the grievances and suggestions of the students must be addressed timely and this institution has a democratic and empathic attitude as clear from the feedback received i.e 68% of students rated excellent. Institution is also working hard for providing timely information about various govt. aids and the procedure to help the needy students as clear from the percentage of feedback received (61 % excellent, 23 % very good and 16% good).
- 10. The success of any institution is dependent upon the involvement of its leader and his/her democratic vision. The feedback received so far is clearly indicating excellent grading (72%) on the above parameter.
- 11. Formation of central student council, taking keen interest in every activity of the institution, also got an excellent grading with maximum 93% is given to the commitment of the institution for providing safe and pollution free environment to the students.




















































































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Feedback on Curriculum from Teachers (Session 2019-20)




Qualitative Analysis



- Curriculum must have the component of developing employability skills among the students related to their local needs.



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FEEDBACK ANALYSIS OF THE CURRICULUM BY HEADS OF THE PRACTICING SCHOOLS (SESSION 2019-20)



An internship programme for four months was conducted and feedback was collected at the end from heads of the internship school on various parameters. Both quantitative and qualitative analysis was conducted. Description is as under:


Qualitative Analysis


- It was experienced by heads that interns know the theoretical base of the curriculum very well but they were not able to put it into practice as no link is established between theory and practice in the teacher education curriculum. So more importance should be given to the practical exposure of the curriculum.
- Heads were of the view that along with the conceptual knowledge, activities related to current affairs should be conducted at the institutional level to keep pace with the latest changes in surroundings.
- Teacher education institution must train students to use a variety of assessment techniques so that objectives related to all the domains of behaviour (Cognitive, Conative and Affective) can be achieved.
- As technology is moving at a rapid pace the students must be given enough e- exposure before sending them for internship.
- Activity based teaching must be there in teacher education institutions and students should be motivated to practice activity based teaching in internship practice.
- New options and electives should be added in the curricula of teacher education programme.




Parameters	% of opinion	Analysis
Regularity of Students	More than 95% yes	As clear from the feedback more than 95% heads reported that interns were regular as institutions made every attempt to have a check on their regularity through frequent visits and personal contacts.
Interest in teaching activities by students	More than 89 % yes	Majority of the Heads were of the opinion that students are interested in teaching activities during their internship programme.
Proper utilization of the time	More than 90 % yes	Interns use their time in an effective manner as the institution conducts pre-internship practice and acquaints students with every phase of the internship programme.
Full preparation on the part of students	More than 84% yes	Majority of the Heads of the internship schools were of the opinion that students come with full preparation.
Use of teaching aids	More than 94% yes	A very high percentage was given to the use of teaching aids by students as during their pre- internship programme institution gave a very good exposure to the students for preparing and using teaching aids

























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ANALYSIS OF THE CURRICULUM FEEDBACK FROM THE ALUMNI (2019-20)





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Analysis of Curriculum Feedback from Alumni (Session 2019-20)

For the session 2019-20 curriculum feedback from 70 alumni were taken. The year 2020 started with a global crisis i.e Covid-19 pandemic which badly affected all the activities related to education. It was quite a challenging time but the institution did its excellent efforts and all the activities related to curriculum were conducted in blended mode. Institution started its own Moodle (Learning management system) and YouTube channel and enriched its teaching learning resources. In the curriculum feedback meeting some concerns were shared by the alumni members like:

- The institution should plan for some self-financed short term courses with focus on skill development. Rural background of the students should be kept in mind while planning these courses.
- One more suggestion was that the institution should work more to provide better sports opportunities to students as rural students have much potential along with their interest in games and sports.
- As suggested in the previous feedback meetings also moral value inculcation among the would-be teachers was again emphasized by the alumni members.
- 4. It was one of the recommendations that yearly placement drives should be a regular feature of the institution so that good placement opportunities will be available to the students at one place.

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CURRICULUM FEEDBACK BY EMPLOYERS (SESSION 2019-20)

As per the feedback received from the previous years, the institution made some qualitative changes in the training programme of would be teachers and to know the efficacy of its programme the feedback from the employers were obtained on the different parameters of curriculum and its transaction. Following suggestions were received.

So more importance should be given to the practical exposure of the curriculum.
- Heads were of the view that along with the conceptual knowledge, activities related to current affairs should be conducted at the institutional level to keep pace with the latest changes in surroundings.
- More emphasis should be given on the development of good communication skills among the would be teachers.
- As technology is moving at a rapid pace the students must be given enough e- exposure.
- Activity based teaching must be there in teacher education institutions and students should be motivated to practice activity based teaching in internship practice.
- More training should be given in Micro-teaching sessions, so that students can learn from their mistakes.
