



## **Report on 4-Day Student Exchange Programme between GHG Khalsa College of Education, Gurusar Sadhar, Ludhiana, and MIER College of Education, Jammu**



**Organizing Institutions: GHG Khalsa College of Education, Gurusar Sadhar, Ludhiana, and MIER College, Jammu**

**Duration: February 19 to 22, 2024**

A 4-day student exchange program between GHG Khalsa College of Education, Gurusar Sadhar, Ludhiana, and MIER College, Jammu, was held from February 19 to 22, 2024. This initiative marked a significant milestone as it was a unique endeavor entirely new to colleges of teacher education in North India. This collaborative effort was conducted under the able stewardship of Dr Pargat Singh Garcha, Principal, GHG Khalsa College of Education and Dr Adit Gupta, from MIER College of Education under the provisions laid by the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) signed between the two colleges on December 22, 2022.

The programme aimed at fostering cultural exchange, promoting academic collaboration, and nurturing interpersonal relationships among students. This program served as a platform for students from both institutions to immerse themselves in a diverse cultural milieu, broaden their perspectives, and develop a deeper understanding of regional nuances and traditions.

The exchange program was conscientiously planned to ensure a meaningful and enriching experience for all participants. It provided a unique opportunity for students to step out of their comfort zones, interact with peers from different cultural backgrounds, and engage in a wide array of academic and cultural activities. Through this exchange, students were not only able to enhance their knowledge and skills but also develop valuable cross-cultural competencies that are increasingly essential in today's globalized world.

The 4-day program was structured to include a variety of activities that catered to the diverse interests and learning preferences of the participants. From cultural performances and interactive workshops to academic sessions and sightseeing tours, every aspect of the exchange was thoughtfully designed to promote meaningful engagement and foster a sense of camaraderie among the students.

### **The objectives**

The objectives of the 4-day student exchange programme between GHG Khalsa College of Education, Gurusar Sadhar, Ludhiana, and MIER College of Education, Jammu, organized from February 19 to 22, 2024, were as follows:

1. **Strengthening Friendly Ties:** The primary objective of the exchange programme was to strengthen the friendly ties between the two institutions. By engaging in collaborative activities, students and faculty members from both colleges had the opportunity to build relationships and foster a sense of camaraderie.

5. **Tapping Resources:** By collaborating under the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), both colleges aimed to tap into each other's resources. This included sharing best practices, educational resources, and innovative ideas to enhance the quality of education and academic activities in both institutions.

The student exchange programme was designed to be a mutually beneficial initiative that would not only strength the bond between the two premier institutions of teacher education, but also enrich the learning experiences of the students and faculty members involved.

**Participants:** A team of 28 students, comprising 22 girls and 6 boys, accompanied by 2 teacher incharges, Mr. Chhotu Ram Jangra, Assistant Professor School of Education, and Ms. Nandini Puri, Assistant Professor School of Social Sciences and Humanities, visited GHG Khalsa Institutes from MIER College of Education, Jammu. Principals, faculty, and students of GHG Khalsa Institutes, including GHG Khalsa College of Education, GHG Khalsa College, and College of Pharmacy, actively participated in the exchange program with the team from MIER College of Education.

#### **The day wise Programme Schedule:**

##### **Day 1 (February 19, 2024):**

**10:30 am: Arrival at Ludhiana Railway Station** Upon arrival at the Ludhiana Railway Station, the students and faculty from MIER College, Jammu, were warmly received by Dr. Manpreet Kaur, Assistant Professor, and Mr. Hardeep, Library Staff from GHG Khalsa College of Education. The welcoming team ensured a smooth transition for the visitors from their journey to the college campus.



**11:30 am: Arrival at Girls' Hostel, GHG Khalsa College** The group then proceeded to the Girls' Hostel at GHG Khalsa College, where they were greeted by Principal Dr. Pargat Singh Garcha, along with faculty and students of GHG Khalsa College of Education, Gurusar Sadhar. Dr. Jasleen Kaur, Assistant Professor at GHG Khalsa College of Education, took charge of the arrangements for the female students' stay, ensuring their comfort and convenience. Simultaneously, Dr. Jagjit Singh, Assistant Professor at GHG Khalsa College of Education, oversaw the stay arrangements for the male students and faculty members from MIER College of Education.

**3:00 pm - 4:00 pm: Visit to Degree College, Pharmacy College:** The afternoon session included a visit to the Degree College and Pharmacy College within the GHG Khalsa College campus. The visitors had the chance to explore the labs, library, and laboratories of these institutions, gaining insights into the academic facilities available.





**4:00 pm: Refreshment in GHGKCE Canteen:** After the visit, the group enjoyed refreshments at the GHG Khalsa College of Education canteen, providing a relaxed atmosphere for informal interactions and discussions.







**4:30 pm: Visit to Gurudwara Sahib, Sadhar and Johra Ji:** A visit to the historical Gurudwara Chevin Paatshahi, Sadhar and Johra Ji was organized, offering the visitors a glimpse into the Sikh religious and cultural practices. This visit provided a cultural immersion experience, fostering an understanding of the local customs and traditions.





**7:00 pm - 8:00 pm: Dinner** The day concluded with dinner arrangements. For the girls, dinner was served in the Girls' Hostel, ensuring their convenience and safety. For boys and staff, dinner was arranged at the Guest House, providing a comfortable dining experience.

The first day of the student exchange programme laid a strong foundation for cultural exchange and mutual learning, setting the tone for the rest of the programme.

### **Day 2 (February 20, 2024):**

**3:00 pm onwards: Visit to Ludhiana City** In the afternoon, participants enjoyed a visit to Ludhiana City for shopping at the local market, Ghumar Mandi. This provided an opportunity for cultural exchange and exploration of the local area. The visit was accompanied by Dr. Jasleen Kaur, adding to the overall experience.
